Excellency Sez:



Matching harness consists of two 3/4 wave sections of 50 ohm coax cable, 3/4 wave assuming a .66 velocity factor, will be 40 inches long.

Important
The 40 inches is measured from the roint where the antenna whip emerges from the RG-58 adapter in the PL-259 connector, to the splice between the harness and the 50 ohm feedline. This means that the actual matching harness length to the solder connection on the SO-239 will be somewhat less than 40 inches. If the length is slightly off, performance will not be affected. However the two harness branches must be exactly the same, other wise nulls will not be sharp and deep, and they will not be exactly 180 degrees apart.

As the sketch shows, only two radials per antenna are used. The other two are not used because of excesive mutual coupling, which degrades performance.

The two RG-58U matching harness leads at the feedling junction can be combined in one PL-259 connector by leaving the braid outside the connector shell, and soldering the two center conductors in the pin. By wrapping #34 or #26 wire around the braids, they can be soldered to the connector shell. In this case however, the 40 inch length is measured to where the two center conductors enter the shell, not where they are soldered into the connector center pin.

The antenna whip and ground plane radials should be the lenghts shown. If matching harness is fabricated properly, SWR will be between 1.4 and 1.2 to 1. Any attempt to bring it lower will degrade performance, although pruning can bring SWR to a negligible value, it is a false value and simply substitutes reactances for an impedance mismatch. Two 1/4 wave antennas 1/2 wave apart display mutual coupling, which lowers radiation resistance to between 75 and 80 ohms. Combining these two with the 50 ohm harness shows a conjugate impedance of about 41.5 ohms at the feedpoint, which is a fairly good match to a 50 ohm feedline.

Both elements of the system must be symmetrical, or nulls will not be 180 degrees apart. Antennas must be straight and parallel, and ground plane radials must be at 45 degrees to the axis of the support arm.

As a safety measure, install plastic leads on the Ground plane radials and the antenna tips. They can be installed easily by heating the ends and pushing the leads on. A drop of epoxy cement in the lead holes will hold them. A little more trouble, but ends can be threaded with a 6-32 die, heated, and the leads turned on while the heated ends form the threads.


