

The Newsletter has been a fun project for me personally, and I'd like to think that perhaps we have gained some new club members along the way because of it. Some of the monthly issues have had a way of seeing a wider distribution than intended as I learned from favorable comments from outside the club.

After a little bit of "railroading", we have found a new Editor, Terry Berg WA9AWO, for the coming year. If you will give him the same good cooperation (inputs, deadlines, etc.), as I received, who knows what that rascal will be able to do in "82".

Thanks to the many hours of help I've had recently from several club members (most notably KC9CJ and K3GGN), the installation of part of the "new logic" went quite well during the week of Thanksgiving. There were a couple of minor problems which we encountered, but they were rather easily solved.

What is new to the repeater system now is the autopatch access logic - both regular and emergency access. The tone decoders on the input are state-of-the-art devices with crystal oscillators for frequency reference. That means no drifting off frequency which makes retuning necessary. Also, the audio level requirements of the decoders is much more tolerant of improperly adjusted tone pads. The result is that if an operator had problems with accessing the patch in the past but could always dial phone numbers, those problems are now eliminated!

Another device which was installed was a multi-function remote control logic system. This is not working now because one of the integrated circuits failed due to a power supply problem (which has been solved). As soon as I can obtain a replacement I.C. chip, this system will be operational.

I am working now on building circuit boards for the "main timing circuits" and "audio interface". When these are done and installed, they will replace the timing circuits presently in use. The result will be an improvement in reliability of the long duration timer (timeout, for example) circuits and more flexible adjustment of the repeater operation. In addition, the audio interface board will allow for expansion which can not be done with the present circuits.

Also in the works is a smart I.D. timing logic board. This will replace the free-running timing system used now which merely activates the transmitter and I.D.'er every 8mins 21sec around the clock. The new timer will allow I.D. cycles to occur only after someone drops the input carrier to the repeater and 2.5 minutes after a QSO ends. It will also allow for the integration of a voice I.D. instead of CW after the QSO ends.

If the group desires, I will continue with developing a user-accessed tape playback system. This would provide, for example, a way of distributing information concerning club events, news, etc., or possibly a swap/sell bulletin board, or anything else one could dream up. The idea is that a pre-recorded message could be played over the air by merely keying in a few touch-tones over the repeater input.

The "new logic" project has involved hundreds of hours of my time to date. Every detail is being thoroughly documented for the future reference. This is why it seems to be taking a long time to see results. Be assured, though, that the things I've described here are rapidly nearing completion. I need your help, however. In January, come to the Club meeting and vote for KA9DDN as Repeater Vice President. My only personal goal is to keep improving WR9AAE for you, the user.




